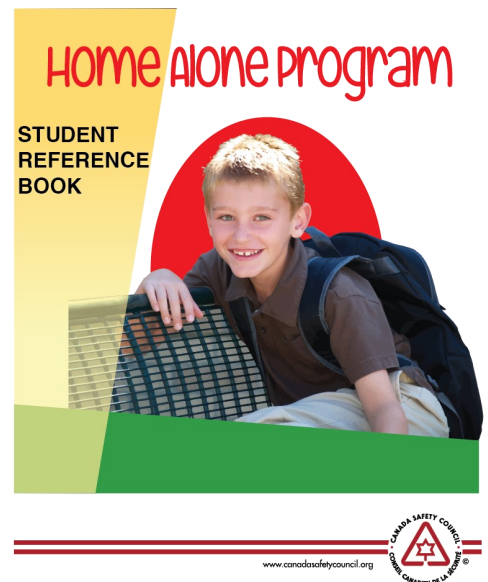

- Internet Safety

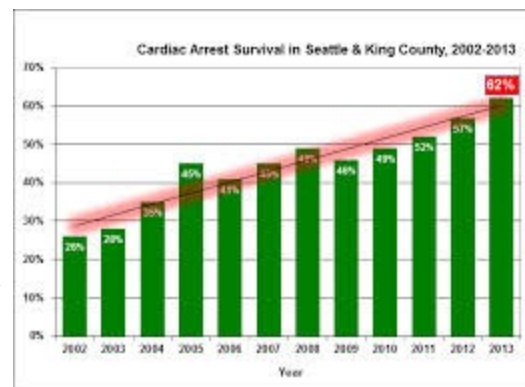


Seattle Washington, King County has world's highest survival rate
